Admission Application Processing

A virtually paperless system that manages university admission paperwork annually reduces application-processing time for approximately 600,000 documents by 50% and saves more than \$20,000. This is achieved by automating the movement of documents, importing on-line application images rather than printing hard copies, and integrating information request forms. On-Line Billing of Telecommunications Services

An online billing system for telecommunications services, developed in-house in lieu of spending \$175,000 to purchase a billing program, eliminates more than 20,000 paper invoices annually and saves a recurring \$30,000 in labor, materials and software agreements. Laboratory Information Management System

Information management software helps to administer a quality control program, an independent assurance program, a laboratory qualification program and a materials certification audit. Users have immediate access to statewide information on more than 30 automated reports. Centralized data storage replaced inconsistent and unsynchronized local storage. Administrative costs are reduced by virtually eliminating paperwork.
